The Ohio University Appalachian Writing Project, supported by the National Writing Project and OhioWINS, was established in 2007 as a program of OU's Center for Writing Excellence and the English Department. We believe that writing has the power to transform students' learning in any subject area and that the teaching of writing can and should be central to learning. We also believe that those best qualified to teach teachers are excellent teachers themselves—teachers who know their schools, know their communities, and know what their students need to be successful. We are therefore committed to the development of the teachers of Appalachian Ohio—to helping them become better writers, thinkers, researchers, and therefore better teachers of writing.

The 2009 Summer Institute is an intensive graduate program for teachers in southeastern Ohio at *any grade level (K-16) in any subject area*. During the four weeks of our Summer Institute, we'll meet every Monday through Friday to work on our own writing—both personal and professional—and to research, study, and share with each other effective ways of teaching writing.

The teachers admitted to this year's Summer Institute will receive a *full scholarship that includes tuition and fee waivers for the 10 graduate hours* of the Institute, as well as all required textbooks.
