

Would you like to take graduate courses for credit this summer?

Are you interested in the opportunity to talk with other instructors about student literacy?

Better yet, would you like to do all this...for **FREE???**

This summer, the English Department at the University of Toledo will be offering a writing institute specifically designed for English and language arts teachers in the state of Ohio. These courses will focus on helping instructors learn to recognize, engage, understand, and assess different student literate practices through means of reading, writing, reflection, and self-assessment. Participants will earn six graduate credits by participating in the institute.

The best part is that these courses are made available with assistance from an OHIO WINS Grant, which supports class instruction along with funding tuition for all class participants. In other words, instructors who agree to participate in one or both of the courses receive free graduate credit and can use these courses as a gateway towards achieving the Certificate in the Teaching of Writing offered through the English Department at the University of Toledo (see <http://www.utoledo.edu/as/english/programs/grad/masterslit/certificate.html>) for more information.

These classes will take place over two weeks, from Wednesday June 10 through Tuesday June 23. Classes will meet from 8:30 am to 4 pm. **Space is limited.**
